1. Standard

What, specifically, do I hope students will understand after studying this text? What do I want them to know or be able to do? What concept(s) do I want them to remember from the study of this text? How does this understanding address the relevant standard?

4. Key Passage (If you do not plan to assign the entire text, excerpt direct quotes.)

5. Questions

What questions would you ask students to lead them to understand the text?
